Fourth Sunday of Easter

Today's passage from the Acts of the Apostles is one of several turning points in the self-understanding of the early Church. Paul evokes the image of "A light to the Gentiles." Some thought that Gentiles, non-Jews, were somehow marginal in God's eyes. The Gentiles in Paul's audience rejoice, because they now see that they are not "second class" members of God's family, but fully part of God's beloved people. The story continues by noting the resistance from those who enjoy "first class" status in the community, as inclusion of the Gentiles was perceived as a threat to their self-image and privilege.

The book of Acts continues to challenge today's societies, churches, and organizations. Luke's vision of God's family, united as equal heirs to the Kingdom of God, confronts our many barriers of wealth, race, gender, and much more. We are invited to give witness to this vision in our life together as the Church.

WHITE ROBES

Our reading from the Book of Revelation presents the image of God's people before God's throne, wearing robes that are washed white in the blood of the Lamb. A robe, especially when worn in God's presence, is meant to express the real truth about the person. A white robe indicates their purity. The washing in the blood of the Lamb (Jesus) suggests that the people have met much suffering, and in some manner, have participated in the suffering of Jesus.

These passages were written to a people experiencing great tribulations in living their faith. But the author of Revelation does not suggest that anyone should seek out suffering for its own sake. He does not make suffering somehow a necessary entry pass for salvation. Our sufferings come from many sources, and suffering is a profound mystery. The image of washing in blood suggests that God is present within our suffering. God accompanies our suffering, leads us toward refreshment, and will wipe every tear from our eyes.

Cuarto Domingo de Pascua

El pasaje de hoy de los Hechos de los Apóstoles es uno de los varios puntos de inflexión en la auto comprensión de la Iglesia primitiva. Pablo evoca la imagen de "Una luz para los gentiles". Algunos pensaban que los gentiles, los no judíos, eran de alguna manera marginales a los ojos de Dios. Los gentiles de la audiencia de Pablo se alegran, porque ahora ven que no son miembros de "segunda clase" de la familia de Dios, sino que forman parte plenamente del pueblo amado de Dios. El relato continúa señalando la resistencia de

los que gozan del estatus de "primera clase" en la comunidad, ya que la inclusión de los gentiles se percibe como una amenaza a su propia imagen y privilegio.

El libro de los Hechos sigue desafiando a las sociedades, iglesias y organizaciones actuales. La visión de Lucas de la familia de Dios, unida como herederos iguales del Reino de Dios, se enfrenta a nuestras muchas barreras de riqueza, raza, género y mucho más. Estamos invitados a dar testimonio de esta visión en nuestra vida en común como Iglesia.

ROPA BLANCA

Nuestra lectura del Apocalipsis presenta la imagen del pueblo de Dios ante el trono de Dios, vistiendo túnicas blancas lavadas en la sangre del Cordero. Una túnica, especialmente cuando se lleva en la presencia de Dios, debe expresar la verdad real de la persona. Una túnica blanca indica su pureza. El lavado en la sangre del Cordero (Jesús) sugiere que el pueblo ha encontrado mucho sufrimiento, y de alguna manera, ha participado en el sufrimiento de Jesús.

Estos pasajes fueron escritos a un pueblo que experimentaba grandes tribulaciones al vivir su fe. Pero el autor del Apocalipsis no sugiere que nadie deba buscar el sufrimiento por sí mismo. No hace que el sufrimiento sea de alguna manera un pase de entrada necesario para la salvación. Nuestros sufrimientos provienen de muchas fuentes, y el sufrimiento es un profundo misterio. La imagen del lavado con sangre sugiere que Dios está presente en nuestro sufrimiento. Dios acompaña nuestro sufrimiento, nos conduce hacia el descanso y enjugará toda lágrima de nuestros ojos.

While private prayer nourishes our individual relationship with the Lord, community prayer is a foretaste of paradise. The book of Revelation depicts a “great multitude” worshipping God “day and night in his temple.” Our churches on Easter Sunday often reflect this happy multitude, filling the pews to bursting. Four Sundays into the festive season, we are encouraged to keep praising God together. In the Acts of the Apostles, Paul and Barnabas demonstrate their instinct to worship with their faith community each Sabbath, dutifully taking their seats in the synagogue. In the Gospel, Jesus calls us his sheep and reminds us why coming together as a flock is so important: uniting in community, we imitate the unity of God.
